Answers:

1. Some who makes candles. (see chandler)
2. Millinery (see milliner)
3. It came about in a Danbury, Connecticut hat factory. Workers were exposed to the toxic mercury which caused neurological symptoms such as the “Danbury Shakes”. (see hatter)
4. A hogshead was a large barrel used to transport tobacco or wine. (see cooper)
5. Ink was made of tannin, iron sulfate, gum, and water. (see printer)
6. Poor Richard’s Almanac was a book of predictions and sayings published by Benjamin Franklin. (see printer)
7. Wealthy patrons could buy candles made of beeswax. (see chandler)
8. Tripoli was used to polish silver (see silversmith)
9. Religion played a major role in life of colonists. In New England, the Puritans controlled much of the culture and were intolerant of other religious groups. Religious diversity was highest in the Middle Colonies. In the Southern Colonies most were Anglican or Baptist. (Click the church).
