1. Which tribe built long bark-covered houses and formed alliances with British colonists during the American Revolution?
2. Which Plains tribe lived in dome-shaped earth lodges and was known for its agricultural innovation along the Missouri River?
3. What tribe was known for expert birchbark canoe building and was part of the Wabanaki Confederacy in Maine?
4. Which powerful confederacy in Virginia consisted of over 30 tribes and had a tribute system under a paramount chief?
5. Which Southwestern tribe is known for intricate fetish carvings, inlaid turquoise jewelry, and a ceremonial calendar tied to agriculture?
6. Which tribe developed expert horsemanship and became feared raiders across the southern Plains, earning the nickname “Lords of the Plains”?
7. Which tribe’s ancestral homeland includes the Great Lakes region, and who are known for harvesting wild rice and maintaining the Midewiwin society?
8. Which tribe practiced salmon ceremonies, built cedar plankhouses, and lived along rivers and coasts of the Pacific Northwest?
9. Which tribe’s traditional territory included the Appalachian valleys and who produced leaders like Tecumseh who resisted U.S. expansion?
10. Which Native group from Hawaii practiced hula, ocean navigation, and lived in a highly organized society ruled by chiefs?

1. **Catawba** – They lived in the Carolinas, made pottery, and allied with British colonists in colonial wars.
2. **Mandan** – Known for earth lodges and advanced farming techniques in the Northern Plains.
3. **Penobscot** – Part of the Wabanaki Confederacy; known for birchbark canoes and resistance to colonization.
4. **Powhatan Confederacy** – Controlled Tidewater Virginia with a complex tribute system led by Wahunsenacawh (Chief Powhatan).
5. **Zuni** – Part of the Puebloan peoples in New Mexico; famous for carvings, jewelry, and seasonal religious ceremonies.
6. **Comanche** – Rose to power through expert horsemanship; dominant force in the southern Plains.
7. **Ojibwe (Anishinaabe)** – Lived in the Great Lakes region; known for wild rice harvesting and spiritual traditions.
8. **Coast Salish** – Built cedar plankhouses, practiced First Salmon ceremonies, and lived in the Pacific Northwest.
9. **Shawnee** – From the Appalachian valleys; resisted colonization and U.S. expansion under Tecumseh.
10. **Native Hawaiians** – Indigenous to the Hawaiian Islands; practiced hula, navigation, and lived under a chiefdom system.
